All trade categories are subject to Informal Bidding Procedures. Contractors that are interested in being on this list are required to have a current license and are subject to verification through the Contractors State license Board.			
Professional Services (Expertise)	Bidding not required. Handled by Departments (not Purchasing). Upon request, Purchasing facilitates RFP process. 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Prior to and During Bid Process:

<u>Local Vendor Preference</u> (5% preference in bid process, for projects up to \$100,000 per bid not including except sales tax.) Does <u>not</u> apply to public projects or professional services. Please refer to the "<u>Local Vendor Preference Policy and Procedure No. 142</u> for details.

After Bid Process:

- City Council Approval-All Purchases/Contracts >\$50K must be approved by City Council.
- <u>Contract/Agreement</u> may apply in addition to a PO. Vendors requested to sign.
- <u>Insurance Requirements:</u> May apply depending on project. (mostly if work performed on City grounds) See <u>Insurance Requirements Summary</u> document for complete details.
- We are not at liberty to discuss the evaluation or selection process until the contract is officially awarded/council approved. Upon approval, bidders are entitled to review winning proposal by written request. We do not as a practice release any documents that show our evaluation of the bids as these documents are protected under the deliberative process privilege.
