III.1:	Control PM10 Emissions in Accordance with BAAQMD Standards. The BAAQMD guidelines identify feasible control measures for construction emissions of PM10. The following list of measures was developed from the BAAQMD master list based on an understanding of the project: a) Water all active construction areas at least twice daily. b) Cover all trucks hauling soil, sand, and other loose materials or require all trucks to maintain at least 2 feet of space from the top of the holding area. c) Apply water three times daily or apply nontoxic soil stabilizers on all unpaved access roads, parking areas, and staging areas. d) Sweep daily (with water sweepers) all paved access roads, parking area and staging areas at construction sites. All trees to be preserved (London Plane trees) shall be enclosed around the Tree Protection Zone (TPZ). The TPZ shall be defined five feet from the trunk.
