Concord Fun Fact - Pavilion designed by famous architect



World famous architect Frank O. Gehry designed the Concord Pavilion in 1975. In the mid1990s, he returned to design the expansion of the facility. Gehry's many world-renowned buildings include the <u>Guggenheim Museum</u> in Bilbao, Spain; <u>Walt Disney Concert Hall</u> in downtown Los Angeles; <u>Experience Music Project</u> in Seattle; <u>Dancing House</u> in Prague; and the <u>Art Gallery of Ontario</u> in Toronto. In 1989, he won the profession's highest honor, the Pritzker Architecture Prize (called "architecture's Nobel").
